

## Sports Premium Statement 2023-2024

At St Teresa's, we are committed to enhancing the quality of physical education and sports for our students. Our school sports premium budget of £18,690 for this academic year is allocated to various initiatives aimed at fostering an active and healthy lifestyle among our pupils. The intention is to use this money to raise standards in curriculum Physical Education, School Sport, Physical Activity and Healthy living.

We allocate a portion of the funding to purchase new sports equipment. Recently, we bought new basketball hoops, netball balls, and a new PE shed, which have enriched our PE curriculum and allowed students and staff to get the most out of PE lessons. The upkeep of equipment ensures that all children can access the learning taking place in their PE lessons.

To promote competitive sports, we use our budget to help cover the costs of the maintenance of the minibus, so the children can attend fixtures with other schools. We currently compete in the Berkshire Schools' Football Association and the Wokingham Football Association leagues. In addition, we also take part in a local schools' netball league. These leagues support the children in learning to be part of a team and the importance of collaboration and communication.

We also take part in School Games. These are sporting events that are run for local schools for children that wouldn't normally take part in sporting events. The activities are designed for children of all abilities and backgrounds, so they can enjoy sport without the pressure of a competitive game.

By strategically allocating our sports premium budget, we aim to create a vibrant sports culture at St Teresa's, where every child feels inspired to participate, learn, and grow physically and socially.
