

Sports Premium Statement 2018-2019

Expected amount allocated: £18690

Our vision at St Teresa's Catholic Primary School is to use our School Sports Premium to create a culture that encourages all children to be active and have a positive attitude towards physical activities and healthy lifestyles. We will be using our funding this year to continue to develop our teachers so they may teach high quality PE and to offer a good level of competitive sports both within our school and at events in the local community. We will be extending the range of physical activities on offer to the children, during PE lessons and clubs, whilst promoting and improving physical activity during playtimes.

Support for Teaching staff to encourage differentiation and extending our high ability sporting children.	50%	We have employed a new PE Teaching Assistant (TA) to assist with the teaching of PE during class time alongside the class teacher. This enables us to teach high level PE but also to extend the high ability sporting children. With our PE TA we are able to offer a wider range of sporting activities which are additional to the school day. The PE TA will promote further opportunities to increase our number of competitive fixtures with other schools and support the development of B teams. The PE TA will assist to foster the increased awareness of the importance of physical activity through a variety of means such as themed weeks (healthy living) and active break times.
Upgrade sporting/playground surfaces to promote active break times and fix any potential hazards	10%	New marking lines on the playground as requested by school council to promote games and activities during break times. Repair to the astroturf area as used for PE lessons. Purchase of new equipment for break times (balls etc.)
Improve equipment to support PE lessons throughout the school.	20%	KS1 and Foundation Stage – improvement of equipment for appropriate activities (balance see-saws, soft catching balls, hoops, bean bags, balance beams) Athletics equipment – following participation in local School Games competition, improving athletic resources for indoor games and promotion of a new competition format. (javelins, stop watches, measuring tapes)
Improve storage of PE equipment	5%	Purchase additional boxes for storage. Outdoor storage for equipment for active break times.

Active Maths	5%	Renewed license of Active maths scheme for all staff members to use to promote physical activity through exciting and practical maths lessons.
Improvement of teaching resources to support healthy and active well-being.	10%	Promotion of healthy and active well-being resources to use throughout the school in class and in line with themed weeks and lessons during the year.
