

Sports Premium Statement 2019-2020

Amount allocated: £18690

Our vision at St Teresa's Catholic Primary School is to use our School Sports Premium to create a culture that encourages all children to be active and have a positive attitude towards physical activities and healthy lifestyles. We have used our funding this year to continue to develop our teachers so they may teach high quality PE and to offer a good level of competitive sports both within our school and at events in the local community. We have looked at ways to extend the range of physical activities on offer to the children, during PE lessons and clubs, whilst promoting and improving physical activity during playtimes.

Support for Teaching staff to encourage differentiation and extending our high ability sporting children.	50%	We employed a PE Teaching Assistant (TA) to assist with the teaching of PE during class time alongside the class teacher. This enables us to teach high level PE but also to extend the high ability sporting children. With our PE TA we are able to offer a wider range of sporting activities which are additional to the school day. The PE TA has promoted further opportunities to increase our number of competitive fixtures with other schools in a variety of sports. The PE TA has helped to foster the increased awareness of the importance of physical activity through a variety of means such as themed weeks (healthy living) and active break times. Support in after school sports clubs and events for football and hockey. Taking children to SEN sports events and forming a collaboration with St Crispin's sports department.
